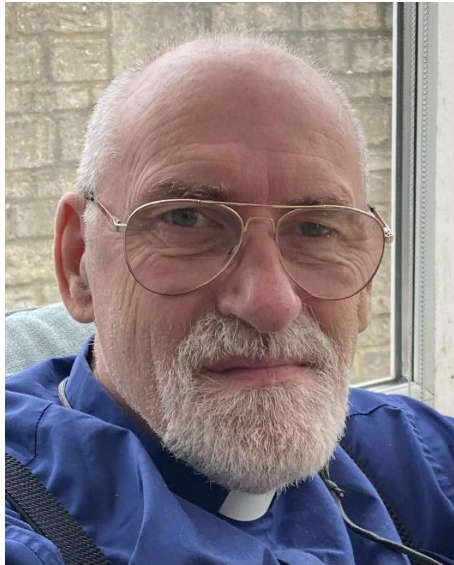




A LONG AND WINDING ROAD
